Great Britain's awesome cycling team go for gold again in the velodrome after breaking their own world record in qualifying. They will have to beat Denmark to earn Bradley Wiggins, *right*, his second gold of the Games. New Zealand and Australia will contest the bronze.

Pamela Jelimo Women's 800m final
Kenya's long wait for a gold medal-winner on the track could end in the two-lap event. Jelimo, *right*, is only 18, but has clocked 1min 54.97sec this season and a repeat of that form should be too much for the rest. The biggest danger could be from Janeth Jepkosgei, her team-mate.

Andy Baddeley Men's 1,500m final
Tipped as a medal contender by Lord Coe, Baddeley, *right*, has lived up to that billing in Beijing. The man who is fitted with a heart monitor after suffering from cardiac arrhythmia, finished third in his semi-final in 3min 37.47sec and could be a dark horse for a medal.
